Since then Dr. Hang has committed his career to advancing a paradigm of thinking in orthodontics that rejects traditional retractive techniques in patients of all ages.

Dr. Hang's Face Focused® treatment techniques are designed to: develop the jaw forward, never backward; work toward proper facial balance; create pleasing facial appearance; protect and/or expand the airway; and produce broad smiles that are complete to the corners of the mouth. When it comes to orthodontics he does not believe that one treatment can fit every patient and strives to always keep treatment times shorter rather than longer.

A large segment of Dr. Hang's practice is treating adults, who have never had orthodontics or have at some point, but suffer from pain, snoring, or OSA. No matter what, they want to have the smile they deserve. Dr. Hang is an innovator in reopening extraction spaces. Yes, opening the spaces where teeth were previously removed for orthodontics and having the teeth replaced with implants is a common treatment plan for Dr. Hang's patients. It's called Extraction Retraction Regret Syndrome™ or E.R.R.S.™ Reversing previous extraction/retraction orthodontics may relieve headaches, TMJ pain, jaw &/ or neck pain, snoring, and even OSA. With the teeth replaced, esthetics can be improved with a broader smile and support for the lips which tends to give a younger appearance.

Today Dr. Hang treats patients from 3 to 80, from across the street and from places as far away as Switzerland, Malaysia and Australia creating beautiful smiles and bettering their lives.

will include seismic upgrades to the bridge structure, addition of sidewalks and designated bicycle lanes, on and off ramp safety improvements, and enhanced traffic movement. This helps the improvements respectfully blend in with the existing area that serves as the "Gateway to the Santa Monica Mountains." The project construction is funded through Measures M and R, which provides regional transportation enhancement funds through Los Angeles Metro. The project construction is scheduled to begin in spring 2018.

City of Thousand Oaks

Thousand Oaks Blvd. Undergrounding

The city of Thousand Oaks partnered with local utility companies Southern California Edison, Spectrum, and Crown Castle to improve Thousand Oaks Boulevard by removing approximately 1.5 miles of overhead electrical wires and 53 electrical poles, from Duesenberg Drive to Westlake High School at Via Merida. The project benefits include: increased safety, enhanced aesthetics, improved pedestrian access, limit future tree topping and increase reliability and provides room for the Westlake High School future stadium expansion. This large scale project was completed on time and \$1 million under budget.

Flashing Yellow Arrows

The city of Thousand Oaks installed five new traffic lights that utilize a flashing yellow arrow signal in an effort to shorten wait times at signals operation with protected left-turn arrow. The new flashing yellow arrow traffic signals have been installed on Thousand Oaks Blvd. at Dallas Dr., Moorpark Rd. at Thousand Oaks High School Driveway, Hillcrest Dr. at Marin St., Thousand Oaks Blvd. at Rancho Road and Thousand Oaks Blvd. at Duesenberg Dr. The flashing yellow lights may not be operational during peak periods at all intersections in order to minimize left turning conflicts with through traffic.
